# IMMUNIZATIONS AND TESTS REQUIRED BY STATE LAW AND CLINICAL FACILITIES

Allied Health students must comply with both New Mexico law and clinical facility requirements related to immunization and testing. Note: Students should not delay completing their immunizations; some take up to 4-6 months to complete.

<u>Once students have applied and been accepted into the program</u>, immunization requirements must be submitted **with documentation** from a physician / healthcare professional upon request.

If students lack documentation of vaccines/vaccine series or current titers showing immunity, they must follow the posted immunization schedules listed below. The minimum time intervals must be met. Travel or accelerated schedules are <u>NOT</u> acceptable for Allied Health Students.

Date(s) of Immunization(s) - Vaccir Results of serologic test if given - Vaccir

Vaccine manufacturer Place of service - Vaccine lot number
Vaccine expiration date - Signature & Printed name of healthcare professional, if possible.

# **REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS**

Immunization	Option 1	Option 2
Measles* (Rubeola)	Two doses of measles vaccine on or after their first birthday and at least 30 days apart <b>*See</b> note	Serologic test positive for measles antibody <b>**See note</b>
Mumps*	<b>Two</b> doses of mumps vaccine on or after their first birthday	Serologic test positive for mumps antibody <b>**See note</b>
Rubella*	<b>One</b> dose of rubella vaccine on or after their first birthday	Serologic test positive for rubella antibody <b>**See note</b>
Hepatitis B (Hep B)	The minimum interval between the first two doses is 4 weeks, and the minimum interval between the second and third doses is 8 weeks. However, the first and third doses should be separated by no less than 16 weeks. It is not necessary to restart the series or add doses because of an extended interval between doses.	Serologic test positive for Hepatitis B antibody <b>**See note</b>
Varicella (Chicken Pox)	<b>Two</b> doses of varicella vaccine on or after their first birthday and at least 90 days apart prior to age thirteen. Vaccination doses should be given 28 days apart after thirteenth birthday.	Serologic test positive for varicella antibody <b>**See note</b> OR <u>Physician-documented</u> history or diagnosis of varicella <b>**See note</b>
<b>Tdap</b> (Tetnus, Diptheria & Pertussis)	Documentation of prior Tdap vaccination. Td booster must be documented if Tdap was received more than ten years prior.	If prior immunization is unknown or undocumented, consult healthcare professional regarding obtaining immunization.
*Measles, Mumps, Rubella is also known as the combined MMR vaccine. This is the preferred vaccine if recipient is eligible.		

\*\*Documentation must show date of test collection or diagnosis, not when primary care provider signed immunization form.

YEARLY REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS		
Tuberculin (TB)	All students must present documentation of a negative tuberculin skin test (PPD) administered within one year of beginning clinical activities involving direct patient care or present evidence of a negative chest x-ray for tuberculosis (TB) obtained within one year of beginning clinical activities, if the TB skin test is positive. <b>Tuberculosis skin tests must be repeated yearly while students are enrolled in any Allied Health Program.</b>	
Influenza	Students are required to receive an annual or seasonal flu vaccination. Flu season generally begins in the fall (September/October) and runs through mid-to-late spring	
DRUG TESTING		
10+ Panel Drug Screen	A mandatory 10+ Panel Drug Screen <u>will be scheduled during the week of orientation</u> . This fee has been covered in your student fees.
