

TRIO SSS provides academic support, aid in postsecondary course selection, and informs students about the full range of financial aid programs, benefits and resources for locating both public and private scholarships. Educational and informational services are offered to improve the financial

and economic literacy of students. Students are also prepared to apply for admission to four-year and professional programs through informational workshops and transfer advising. Additionally, as it is the goal of TRIO SSS to retain each student until degree completion, TRIO SSS of-

fers individualized peer mentoring for each active participant. TRIO SSS **may also** provide individualized advising



Program Description:

Through a grant competition, funds are awarded to institutions of higher education to provide opportunities for academic development, assist students with basic college requirements, and to mo-

tivate students towards the successful completion of their postsecondary education. Student Support Services (SSS) projects also may provide grant aid to current SSS participants who are receiving

Federal Pell Grants. The goal of TRIO SSS is to increase the college retention and graduation rates of its participants.


What are some definitions that we all need to know?

- **Syllabus**
An outline or a summary of the main points of a text, lecture, or course of study.
- **Audit**
Auditing a course allows students to review a subject area as a refresher or for general use.
- **Completed Hours**
Total number of credit hours taken and passed in a college.
- **Transcript**
This is the official document containing the record of a student's academic performance and testing history. The transcript must be issued by the school at which a student is or has been officially enrolled and should be certified by the signature of an authorized school administrator. The school's official seal or watermarked school stationary may also be used to authenticate the transcript.
- **FAFSA**
The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (known as the FAFSA) is a form that can be prepared annually by current and prospective college students (undergraduate and graduate) in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid (including the Pell Grant, Federal student loans and Federal Work-Study).

Grant Aid Requirements:

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANT AID ELIGIBILITY

Spring 2016

Must be in the first two years of postsecondary education, receiving a Federal Pell Grant, and have attempted less than 92 hours (150% of selected program of study).

Must have an unmet financial need as verified by the CCC Financial Aid Office.

Must be in good academic standing and maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher at all times.

Must complete the Spring 2016 GA Application and Essay to be turned in no later than Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

Must select Essay Exercise and adhere to all Essay Exercise requirements. The depth and quality of the submission will be assessed.

Must submit GA application in blue or black ink only.

GA Essay must be typed in Times New Roman, 12 point font, MLA format preferred.

Must participate in the formal reading of GA Essay as a component of the Spring 2016 GA Application Process.

Must make contact with their assigned mentor for at least 50% of all weekly contacts for the semester.

Must attend a live workshop given by peer mentors or full-time staff no later than Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

Must attend a live GA Budgeting Workshop given by full-time staff no later than Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

Must participate in at least fifteen hours of TRiO SSS Services by Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

Must have completed a CSI (College Student Inventory) and Financial Literacy 101 Online Workshop on file by Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

New and existing TRiO SSS participants must complete an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or UIEP for the Spring 2016 Semester by Friday, March 18, 2016, 4:30 p.m.

Must not hold over two absences from any TRiO SSS appointment by the application deadline date.

FINANCIAL AID ANNOUNCEMENTS:

If a student's Pell file is complete by **February 1, 2016**, the **1st Pell** disbursement checks will be mailed out **February 12, 2016**.

1st loan disbursement checks will be mailed **February 19, 2016**.

2nd Pell disbursement checks will be mailed out **March 3, 2016**.

3rd Pell disbursement checks and **2nd loan** disbursement checks will be mailed out **March 25, 2016**.

2nd mini term Pell and loan disbursement checks will be mailed out **March 25, 2016**.

NMSIG, SEOG, and CAG checks will be mailed **March 3, 2016**.

1st disbursement is 35% of Pell

2nd disbursement is 35% of Pell

3rd disbursement is 30% of Pell

*****Note: there will be no financial aid checks processed from March 7, 2016 through March 18, 2016*****

An economic system in which economic decisions and the pricing of goods and services are guided solely by the aggregate interactions of a country's citizens and businesses and there is little government intervention or central planning




Financial Literacy Tip!

FICO Credit Score Make-

Up:

- Payment history (35%)
- Amounts owed (30%)
- Length of credit history (15%)
- Types of credit in use (10%)
- New credit (10%)

Loans - Interest Rate and Calculation:

A rate which is charged or paid for the use of money. An interest rate is often expressed as an annual percentage of the principal. It is calculated by dividing the amount of interest by the amount of principal.

P = principle, R = rate, T = time (normally in years) and I = Interest.

$$P \text{ (principal)} \times R \text{ (rate)} \times T \text{ (time)} = I \text{ (interest)}$$

$$\text{Principle} + \text{Interest} = \text{Total Amount to be Paid}$$




Writing Center




The Writing Center is located next to the Cyber Café in the Library in Conference Room A
